



Superintendent's Report for DEC Lead, Learn and Grow September 3, 2025



Ensure that all employees are empowered to excel in their roles.

- **Early Development for Growth in Education (EDGE)** – our early career teacher orientation hosted two sessions August 15 (K-5) and August 19 (6-12). Approximately 100 people registered. Support includes orientation, mentor (17 retired teachers), school-based mentors, lead teachers and subject coordinators. Three (3) retired resource teachers are also supporting new resource teachers.
- August 22 - 14 retired educators received mentorship training. They will be supporting new teachers as needed for the first six weeks of the school year until new teachers are assigned mentors within their school.
- August 19 Orientation for new administrators.
- August 20 School Administrators' Meeting and School Administrative Assistants' Meeting.

Strengthen our inclusive system to be anti-racist, affirming, and equitable; To honor diversity and welcome all students.

- School principals were reminded to share Policy 368 – Antiracism and Equity Policy with their staff and the SharePoint site of resources with their new teachers.
- Summer Professional learning:
 - NB Black History Bus tour, July 30 (19 educators) - Ralph Thomas and Mutiat Adeleke (NB Black History Society) facilitated the tour to Spar Cove Road, Beaver Harbour (special presentation by student), Grand Bay-Westfield, and Willow Grove.
 - Presentation by Graeme Nickerson (PhD candidate in Atlantic Canadian Black History), July 31 (15 educators) – bus tour of different sites in Fredericton.
 - Uptown Fredericton Walking Tour with Graeme Nickerson, NB Black History Exhibits at the Fredericton Museum, Flag raising ceremony for Emancipation day, and NB Black Identity and Expression through the arts by Thandiwe McCarthy and Gary Weekes, August 1 (15 educators).

Improve student engagement and achievement by enhancing evidence based instructional and assessment practices.

- Assessment Academy, August 21 – cohort two finished their second module. August 22 - cohort one had their fourth of five modules.
- August 26 District led curriculum sessions covering all subject areas were offered during the NBTA Professional Learning day.
- August 28 Education and Early Childhood Department led curriculum professional learning day with opportunities for most subject areas and included the rollout of an updated Kindergarten-5 math curriculum.
